AMARILLO ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION President and CEO KEVIN CARTER reported that PRODUCER OWNED BEEF is doing several million dollars in dirt work on their facility and expects to begin pouring concrete soon. Carter also reported that ALBERS AEROSPACE is officially up and

running in Amarillo and **AUSTIN HOSE** is wrapping up construction of their new \$15 million facility in the South Georgia Business Park. **PLANT AGRICULTURAL SYSTEMS**, the group's latest project, is expected to result in more than \$500 million in capital investment and employ over 700 people. Carter also noted that Amazon is expanding their presence in Amarillo. They are building a new "final mile" facility but will not seek any additional incentives for it. And Carter noted the AEDC has sold 254 acres to **INTERNATIONAL PAPER** for just over \$6 million for a future project.

The project is expected to take 12-14 months with an anticipated opening in January of 2025. Northwest Emergency at Town Square serves over 20,000 patients and Northwest Emergency on Georgia serves over 25,000 patients annually. Both locations have Geriatric Emergency Department Accreditations by the American College of Emergency Physicians.
