He holds a Ph.D. from the University of Calcutta and has postdoctoral training from prestigious institutions like Harvard Medical School and the Hyogo Institute of Clinical Research. Currently a Professor at Texas Tech University, his research focuses on cardiovascular stem cell therapies, regenerative medicine, and immunology. He has received numerous awards, including induction into the National

Academy of Inventors and the American Heart Association. Prof. Das has authored several publications and holds multiple patents.

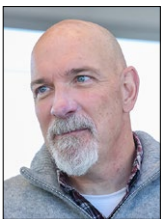

ceremony held later that day. "These nursing graduates have gained incredible knowledge and skills through relentless determination to be the best registered nurses they can be. What they have learned here at WT will have a positive impact on patient care for families and communities across the Panhandle and throughout Texas," said **LAURA REYHER**, director of the **STREET SCHOOL OF NURSING AND WT'S LAURA AND JOE STREET PROFESSOR OF NURSING**. Of the 49 graduates, 88 percent plan to work in Amarillo or the Panhandle region. Established in 1972 and graduating its first students in 1974, WT's Street School of Nursing currently provides about 70 percent of nurses employed throughout the Texas Panhandle. WT nursing graduates, over the past five years, have averaged a 92 percent score on the National Council Licensure Examination, required by the National Council of State Boards of Nursing to test the competency of nursing school graduates in the United States and Canada. Nationally, the average is 85 percent; in Texas, it's 87 percent.



As a **WEST TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY** student, **RANDY RIKEL** gave tours to prospective new Buffs and even helped out at the University's 75th anniversary celebration. Now, after about 40 years and two careers at WT, Rikel has retired at the end of

University–Texarkana and the University of Dallas, Rikel returned to WT in May 2015. Rikel, a CPA who is active in several state business professional organizations, has overseen the University's physical facilities and contract management along with supervising the Accounting and Business Office, Budget Office, Buff Gold Card Office, Human Resources, Post Office, Purchasing and Inventory Services, Risk Management, University Bookstore and the University Police Department. **TODD MCNEILL**, who is currently associate vice president for finance and controller, will serve as interim vice president for business and finance.



C. PATRICK REYNOLDS, M.D., Ph.D., director of the School of Medicine Pediatric Cancer Research Center at the **TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY HEALTH SCIENCES CENTER (TTUHSC)**, has dedicated his life as a researcher to developing treatments for childhood cancers, including neuroblastoma, the most common cancer outside of the brain in infants and young children that is very aggressive

and fatal for many children. To recognize the career of contributions he has made to help these young patients, the **NATIONAL ACADEMY OF INVENTORS (NAI)** named Reynolds to its **2025 CLASS OF FELLOWS**, considered to be the highest professional distinction awarded solely to inventors. He will be inducted June 4 during the NAI's 15th Annual Conference in Los Angeles. The 2025 Class of Fellows is comprised of 169 emerging inventors representing 127 NAI Member Institutions, including universities, government agencies and research institutions from 40 states. A co-inventor on multiple issued and pending patents, Reynolds, a TTUHSC professor of pediatrics, medicine and cell biology and biochemistry, was a pioneer in developing isotretinoin, a differentiating agent for treating neuroblastoma. His research currently focuses on using telomere maintenance mechanisms as cancer biomarkers for neuroblastoma and other cancers and developing agents to specifically target alternative lengthening of telomere cancers. He also studies mechanisms of resistance to drugs and antibody therapy in childhood and adult cancers, biobanking human cancers and developing novel preclinical testing systems for cancer drug development.

Amarillo philanthropist **MARGARET HODGE** and the **DOWNTOWN ATHLETIC CLUB** have provided a lead gift of \$100,000 to the **TEXAS PANHANDLE FIRST RESPONDERS MEMORIAL** to be built at 11th and Polk in downtown Amarillo. The donation, in honor of her late husband **JERRY HODGE**, was a gift of the heart for Mrs. Hodge.

Amarillo Blvd. The new facility is part of **THE TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY SYSTEM'S** Charles W. "Doc" Graham '53 DVM Center complex, located at 3211 Russell Long Blvd. on the WTAMU campus. This center encompasses **THE TEXAS A&M VETERINARY EDUCATION, RESEARCH AND OUTREACH, VERO, and THE TEXAS A&M VETERINARY MEDICAL DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY** complex. The multi-use facility will provide office space to support about 60 faculty and staff for the Agrilife Research and **TEXAS A&M AGRILIFE EXTENSION SERVICE** agencies. Signature research programs headquartered at the new facility include beef cattle nutrition and health, wheat breeding and genetics, irrigation water management, water-limited forage systems, plant physiology, plant pathology, entomology, soil science and sustainable livestock systems engineering. *AW*
