A \$5 million gift to WEST TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY'S **COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING** will establish a research arm that will advance vital innovations in the region. The gift, from a foundation that wishes to remain anonymous, is the largest single gift to date for WT's engineering college. It also pushes WT's historic ONE WEST comprehensive fundraising campaign over its \$175 million goal. The foundation's gift will help establish an institute for engineering research. Under the terms of the gift, the College will continue to secure a minimum of \$500,000 for each of the next 10 years in external research funding that will focus on opportunities and issues in the Panhandle region. The foundation then will contribute \$500,000 annually for use by the College to establish endowments to support its people, programs and places—the priorities of the One West campaign. DR. EMILY HUNT is dean of the College of Engineering and board member for the American Society for Engineering Education's Engineering Research Council. DR. ANGELA **SPAULDING**, vice president for research and dean of the Graduate School, said the "transformative" investment in the WT College of Engineering will enhance WT's ability to pursue research that addresses the most pressing challenges facing the Texas Panhandle and similar research worldwide.

In further news from WEST TEXAS A&M UNIVERSITY, thousands of school employees throughout most of the western part of Texas and at small schools around the state now are eligible for 50-percent discounts for continuing their education at West Texas A&M University. The WT EDUCATORS EXCELLENCE INITIATIVE launched in June in the Region 16 Education Service Center in the Panhandle, offering half-off tuition and mandatory fees for full-time teachers, administrators, librarians, nurses, counselors or paraprofessionals, as well as employees of the ESC. Now, the initiative is expanding to Regions 17 (based in Lubbock) and 18 (based in Midland), as well as 1A and 2A school across the state. The initiative's expansion is expected to cover tens of thousands of full-time educators in the state. "WT began as a

normal school, providing a training ground for educators, and the Terry B. Rogers College of Education and Social Sciences remains central to WT's mission," WT President WALTER V. WENDLER said. "The success of the WT Educators Excellence Initiative in Region 16 proves that rural teachers and other school employees are eager to further their education, and we are committed to assisting districts around the state in preparing their employees for the unique opportunities and challenges with smaller school districts." Prospective students from those ESCs or school districts may enroll for spring 2026 classes in undergraduate courses or through the WT Graduate School. Students interested in pursuing a doctorate in educational leadership can apply to join the January 2027 cohort.

The AMARILLO AREA BEEF COMMUNITY recently presented a check for \$100,907 to the SNACK PAK 4 KIDS (SP4K) BEEF FUND. One hundred percent of the money raised will provide high-quality beef protein to food-insecure students through the Snack Pak 4 Kids® weekend backpack program. The check was presented at the seventh annual Beef 4 Kids Classic golf tournament. Over \$800,000 has been raised since the tournament started. DYRON HOWELL is Founder and Executive Director of Snack Pak 4 Kids. The SP4K Beef Fund launched in October 2017. The program was designed to provide more protein over the weekend for hungry students in the Texas Panhandle. "Texas Cattle Feeders Association members are committed to caring for the communities that they live and work in," said LINDSEY SAWIN, TCFA Communications Manager. "The cattle feeding community is proud of the beef they produce and grateful for the opportunity to partner with Snack Pak to help ensure students across the Panhandle have beef in their backpacks each week."

"This is actually the second gift to the Memorial from Amarillo HOG and Tripp's Harley-Davidson," says WENDI SWOPE, who serves on the board tasked with constructing the First Responders Memorial. "These two philanthropic groups committed to helping make this project happen, and they are following through full force." Amarillo HOG and Tripp's Harley-Davidson donated \$5,000 to the Memorial following the 2024 High Plains Raffle Run and \$12,000 following the 2025 Raffle Run. Organizers of the Texas Panhandle First Responders Memorial will launch a final fundraising campaign this fall, with the goal of raising the final \$150,000 needed to begin construction on the Memorial, which will be located in downtown Amarillo at the corner of 11th and Polk Streets. The Memorial will recognize first responders from 45 area first responding agencies who made the ultimate sacrifice while protecting their communities." This is a monument to true heroism and service honoring area firefighters, law enforcement, and EMS personnel who have died in the line of duty," says Amarillo Firefighter JASON LOVE. "It includes first responders we tragically lost back in 1882 through 2024." AW
